## Safety and use.....

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your cellphone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

### • TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given that studies show that using a cellphone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their cellphone when the vehicle is not parked. Check the laws and regulations on the use of wireless cellphones and their accessories in the areas where you drive. Always obey them. The use of these devices may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas.

When driving, do not use your cellphone and headphones to listen to music or to the radio. Using headphones can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas.

When switched on, your cellphone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your cellphone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area.
- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the car's electronic devices are shielded from cellphone RF energy.

### • CONDITIONS OF USE:

You are advised to switch off the cellphone from time to time to optimize its performance.

Remember to abide by local authority rules of cellphone use on aircrafts.

Operational Warnings: Obey all posted signs when using mobile devices in public areas.

Follow Instructions to Avoid Interference Problems: Turn off your mobile device in any location where posted notices instruct you to do so. In an aircraft, turn off your mobile device whenever instructed to do so by airline staff. If your mobile device offers an airplane mode or similar feature, consult airline staff about using it in flight.

Switch the cellphone off when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, cellphones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency.

Switch the cellphone off when you are near gas or flammable liquids. Strictly obey all signs and instructions posted in a fuel depot, gas station, or chemical plant, or in any potentially explosive atmosphere.

When the cellphone is switched on, it should be kept at least 15 cm from any medical device such as a pacemaker, a hearing aid or insulin pump. In particular when using the cellphone you should hold it against the ear on the opposite side to the device, if any.

Read and follow the directions from the manufacturer of your implantable medical device. If you have any questions about using your mobile device with your implantable medical device, consult your healthcare provider.

To avoid hearing impairment, answer the call before holding your cellphone to your ear. Also move the handset away from your ear while using the "hands-free" option because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage. It is recommended to have proper supervision while small children use your cellphone.

When replacing the cover please note that your cellphone may contain substances that could create an allergic reaction.

Always handle your cellphone with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.

Do not allow your cellphone to be exposed to adverse weather or environmental conditions (moisture, humidity, rain, infiltration of liquids, dust, sea air, etc.). The manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range is -10°C (14°F) to +55°C (131°F) (the max value depends on device, materials and housing paint/texture).

Over 55°C (131°F) the legibility of the cellphone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.

Do not open or attempt to repair your cellphone yourself.

Do not drop, throw or try to bend your cellphone.

Do not use the cellphone if the glass made screen, is damaged, cracked or broken to avoid any injury.

Do not paint it.

Use only batteries, battery chargers, and accessories which are recommended by TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates and are compatible with your cellphone model.

TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates disclaim any liability for damage caused by the use of other chargers or batteries.

Your cellphone should not be disposed of in a municipal waste. Please check local regulations for disposal of electronic products.

Remember to make back-up copies or keep a written record of all important information stored in your cellphone.

Some people may suffer epileptic seizures or blackouts when exposed to flashing lights, or when playing video games. These seizures or blackouts may occur even if a person never had a previous seizure or blackout. If you have experienced seizures or blackouts, or if you have a family history of such occurrences, please consult your doctor before playing video games on your cellphone or enabling a flashing-lights feature on your cellphone. Parents should monitor their children's use of video games or other features that incorporate flashing lights on the cellphones.

All persons should discontinue use and consult a doctor if any of the following symptoms occur: convulsion, eye or muscle twitching, loss of awareness, involuntary movements, or disorientation.

To limit the likelihood of such symptoms, please take the following safety precautions:

- Play at the farthest distance possible from the screen.

When you play games on your cellphone, you may experience occasional discomfort in your hands, arms, shoulders, neck, or other parts of your body. Follow these instructions to avoid problems such as tendinitis, carpal tunnel syndrome, or other musculoskeletal disorders:

- Take a minimum of a 15-minute break every hour of game playing.

- If your hands, wrists, or arms become tired or sore while playing, stop and rest for several hours before playing again.

- If you continue to have sore hands, wrists, or arms during or after playing, stop the game and see a doctor.



Prolonged exposure to music at full volume using the music player may damage your hearing. Set your cellphone's volume to its lowest setting prior to inserting headphones in your ears and adjust the volume to your preference. Only use headphones that are recommended by TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates.

## • PRIVACY:

Please note that you must respect the laws and regulations in force in your jurisdiction or other jurisdiction(s) where you will use your cellphone regarding taking photographs and recording sounds with your cellphone. Pursuant to such laws and regulations, it may be strictly forbidden to take photographs and/or to record the voices of other people or any of their personal attributes, and reproduce or distribute them, as this may be considered to be an invasion of privacy.

It is the user's sole responsibility to ensure that prior authorization be obtained, if necessary, in order to record private or confidential conversations or take a photograph of another person; the manufacturer, the seller or vendor of your cellphone (including the operator) disclaim any liability which may result from the improper use of the cellphone.

## • BATTERY AND ACCESSORIES:

Before removing the battery from your cellphone, please make sure that the cellphone is switched off.

Observe the following precautions for battery use:

- Do not attempt to open the battery (due to the risk of toxic fumes and burns).

- Do not puncture, disassemble or cause a short-circuit in a battery,

- Do not burn or dispose of a used battery in the garbage or store it at temperatures above 60°C (140°F).

Batteries must be disposed of in accordance with locally applicable environmental regulations. Only use the battery for the purpose for which it was designed. Never use damaged batteries or those not recommended by TCT Mobile Limited and/or its affiliates.

## • RADIO WAVES:

**THIS CELLPHONE MEETS THE GOVERNMENT'S REQUIREMENTS FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES.**

Your cellphone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio-frequency (RF) energy.

These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. These guidelines include a substantial safety margin designed to ensure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for cellphones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by public authorities such as the Federal Communications Commission of the US Government (FCC), or by Industry Canada, is 1.6 W/kg averaged over 1 gram of body tissue. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the cellphone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands.

Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the cellphone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the cellphone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the cellphone.

Before a cellphone model is available for sale to the public, compliance with national regulations and standards must be shown.

The highest SAR value for this model cellphone when tested is 0.689 W/Kg for use at the ear and 1.16 W/Kg, for use close to the body.

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various cellphones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for RF exposure. For body-worn operation, the cellphone meets FCC RF exposure guidelines provided that it is used with a non-metallic accessory with the handset at least 1.5 cm from the body. Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines.

If you are using another accessory ensure that whatever product is used is free of any metal and that it positions the cellphone at least 1.5 cm away from the body.

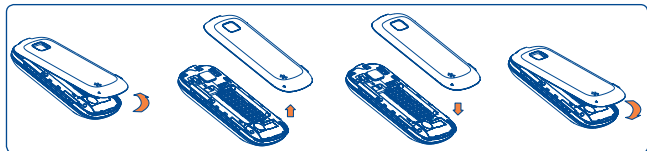

# Getting started .....

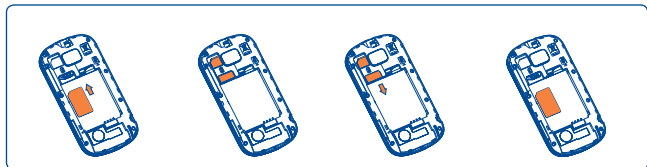
## 1.1 Set-up

### Removing or installing the back cover



### Inserting or removing the SIM card <sup>(1)</sup>

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. Please power off your cellphone and remove battery before inserting or removing the SIM card.



After removing the back cover, insert your SIM card according to the graphics on the back of the cellphone. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the card, press and slide it out.

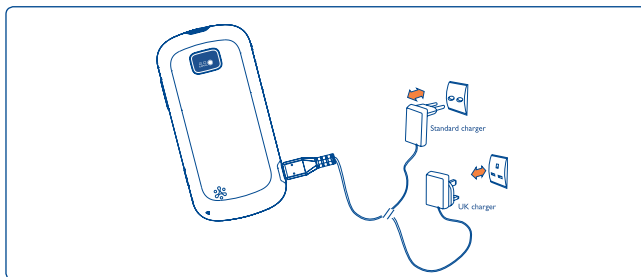
<sup>(1)</sup> Check with your network operator to make sure that your SIM card is 3V or 1.8V compatible. The old 5 Volt cards can no longer be used. Please contact your operator.

### Installing or removing the battery



- Insert and click the battery into place, then close the cellphone cover.
- Unclip the cover, then remove the battery.

### Charging the battery



Connect the battery charger to your cellphone and outlet respectively.

- Charging may take about 20 minutes to start if the battery is flat.
- Be careful not to force the plug into the socket.
- Make sure the battery is correctly inserted before connecting the charger.
- The outlet must be near to the cellphone and easily accessible (avoid electric extension cables).
- When using your cellphone for the first time, charge the battery fully (approximately 3 hours). You are advised to fully charge the battery (🔋).



To reduce power consumption and energy waste, when battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the outlet; switch off Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

## 1.2 Power on your cellphone

Hold down the  key until the cellphone powers on, type in your PIN code if necessary and then confirm. The Home screen is displayed.

If you do not know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code with your cellphone. Store this information in a safe place when not in use.

If Broadcast SMS are displayed, touch to browse through them or press  to return to the Home screen.

While the cellphone is searching for a network, "**Searching/Emergency**" will be displayed.

## 1.3 Power off your cellphone

Hold down the  key until the cellphone powers off.

## 1.4 Using the touchscreen

### Touch



To access an application, touch it with your finger.

### Drag



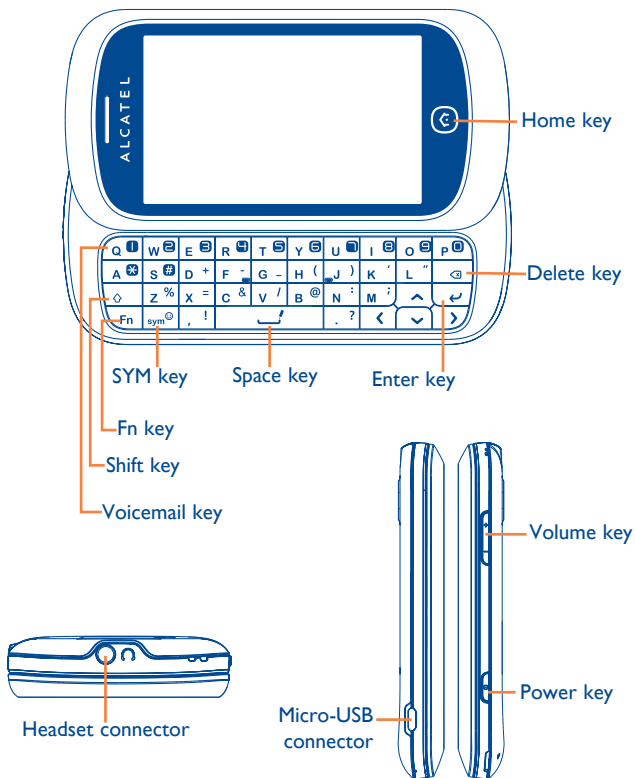
Place your finger on the screen to drag the object to the destination.

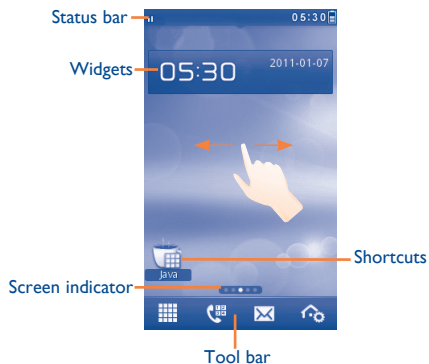

## 2.2 Home screen

The Home screen is provided in an extended format to provide you with more space for adding widgets and shortcuts. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view of the Home screen. Small dots at the bottom of the screen indicate which screen you are viewing.

Touch the status bar and drag down to open, drag up to close.

To open an application, touch it from the list.

### 2.2.3 Toolbar


Toolbar with 4 fixed shortcuts to access **main menu**, **making a call (Call log/Contacts)**, **Messages**, **edit the Home screen**.

## 2.2.4 Personalize the Homescreen

### Adding items

To add an item from the main menu, you can select one of the following ways:


- Touch and hold an item from the main menu list.
- Touch  from the tool bar and select **"Add widgets/Add shortcuts"**.
- Touch and hold an empty area from the main screen, select **"Add widgets/Add shortcuts"** from the window that opens, then touch the item you want to add to the Home screen.

### Editing/Removing/Re-organizing items

Press and hold the application on the Home screen to edit/remove/re-organize it, touch  to edit (only for my favorites), touch  to remove. Touch and hold the application until location frames show up on the Homescreen, then drag it to the location you desire.

### Customizing wallpaper

To personalize your wallpaper, you can select one of the following two ways:






- Touch and hold an empty area from the Home screen, select **"Wallpaper"**, then touch a folder to select an image as your wallpaper.
- Touch  from the tool bar, select **"Wallpaper"**, then touch a folder to select an image as your wallpaper (See page 51).



# 3 Making a call.....

## 3.1 Placing a call

To place a call, you can either type the desired number directly on the hardware keypad, or you can touch  on the tool bar.




Enter the desired number on the on-screen keypad directly or select a contact from Call log or Contacts by touching  or  respectively, then touch  to place the call. Press  to return to the Home screen. If you want to return to the call screen, touch .



The number you entered can be saved to Contacts by selecting . If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching .

To hang up the call, press the  key.

## Making an emergency call

If your cellphone has network coverage, dial emergency number and touch  to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code.

### 3.2 Calling your voicemail <sup>(1)</sup>




Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time. To access your voicemail, hold down  on the on-screen keypad or press and hold .


If the access number for your operator's voicemail service does not work, dial the number that you were given. To change this number at a later date, refer to "**My numbers**" (see page 44).



To use your voicemail service from abroad, contact your network operator before leaving.

### 3.3 Receiving a call

When you receive an incoming call, drag the green cellphone icon  to the right to answer. Press  to return to the Home screen. If you want to return to the call screen, touch .

If the  icon is displayed, the vibrator is activated and there is no ringtone.

If the  icon is displayed, the cellphone neither rings nor vibrates.



The caller's number is displayed if it is transmitted by the network (contact your network operator to check service availability).

<sup>(1)</sup> Contact your network operator to check service availability.

## Muting the ringtone




You may mute ringtone of current incoming call by press Volume key.

### Rejecting a call

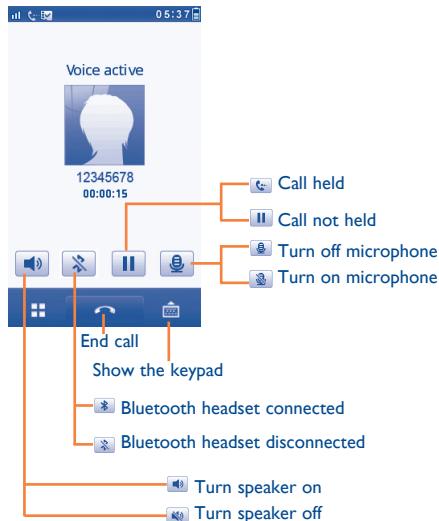
Press the  key or drag the red cellphone icon  to the left to reject the call. Or, to reject an SMS call, drag down the yellow message icon .

### 3.4 During a call <sup>(1)</sup>

#### Available functions

During a call, touch  to use your contacts, calendar, short messages etc. without losing your caller. Press  to return to the Home screen. If you want to return to the call screen, touch .

<sup>(1)</sup> Contact your network operator to check service availability.




Move the handset away from your ear while turn on the speaker because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

You can switch the audio function from handset to Bluetooth device when connected.



### Adjusting the volume

You can adjust the sound level during a call using the Volume key.

### Handling two calls

- Answering a second call (ensure that "Call waiting" is activated, see page 45).
- To call a second party during a call, you may touch  and select "New call".

### 3.5 Conference calls <sup>(1)</sup>

Your cellphone allows you to talk to several people at the same time (up to five). If you are on a double call, touch  and select "Conference call". If a third call comes in, answer it by dragging the green cellphone icon  to the right and speak with your new caller.

This caller becomes a member of the conference if you press  and select "Conference call".

### 3.6 Line switching <sup>(1)</sup>

Your SIM card can contain two distinct cellphone numbers. Under "Call log\Options\Call settings", choose "Line switching" and then select a default line; all your outgoing calls will be made from this number. Incoming calls, however, will continue to use either of the two lines.

The services programmed on the default line do not impact those selected on the other line.

## 4 Menu arrange.....



The main menu can be altered according to your preference.

To access this function, first select  to enter the main menu.

### Change the order

Select "**Move**" via , which will take you to the main menu option mode. Focusing on the main menu item you want to move will place a tick "✓" next to it, then release it at your preferred location. When finished, touch "**Done**" to save the operation.

### Add and remove

Select "**Add and remove**" via , touch the left check box of the selected menu once to add/remove. When finished, touch  to save the operation.

## 5 Messages.....



You can create, edit and receive SMS and MMS with this cellphone.




MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations and sounds to other compatible mobiles and e-mail addresses.




The MMS function can only be used if the service is provided by your operator, and if your contract includes the MMS option and if all the parameters for MMS have been entered (see page 34).

### 5.1 Access







You may access this menu using the following options:

- Touch  to enter the main menu screen, and then select .
- Access from tool bar by selecting .

### 5.2 Conversational On (Off) mode



In conversational on mode, you can view chat history in chronological order. In conversational off mode, you can access the following folders: **Inbox, Outbox, Sent, Broadcast SMS, Voicemail, Drafts**, etc. You can switch between these two modes by selecting "**Switch view mode**" via . Conversational on mode is set as the default mode and the following instructions are based on this mode.

## Useful icons:

## 5.3 Write message

Touch  to create text/multimedia messages (See page 88).


One or more recipients can be added from the contact list. To remove a recipient, move the cursor to the end of the recipient's name, and touch . You can select a recipient from Contacts by touching .

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when: images, videos, audio, slides or attachments are inserted; Subject, CC/BCC/email address is added; or the message contains more than 8 pages of text.

 Specific letters (accent) will increase the size of the SMS, this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

## Timer send

Schedule an SMS/MMS to be sent out at predefined time (select "Timer send" via .

 An SMS message of more than a certain number of characters (the number of characters depends on your language) will be charged as several SMS. An MMS message containing photos and/or sounds may also be billed as more than one message.

## 5.4 Search

To search for a thread, you may touch  and input the initial of a contact name. Subsequent letters may be added to refine the search.

## 5.5 Alerts

### 5.5.1 WAP messages

Folder for WAP push messages.

### 5.5.2 Setting messages

Folder for provisioning messages.



### 5.5.3 Voicemail

View and edit your voicemail number.

### 5.5.4 Broadcast SMS

Folder for broadcast SMS.

## 5.6 Delete threads

To delete threads (containing all conversations), touch  and multi-select the threads you want to delete and then touch .

## 5.7 Available options

### 5.7.1 Switch view mode

You can switch message view mode between conversational on and off modes.

### 5.7.2 Settings

#### Text messages

<b>Profile settings</b>	Profiles can be retrieved directly from SIM card. Alternatively, you can create your own profile.
<b>Common settings</b>	Delivery report, request for acknowledgement of delivery report On/Off. Reply path <sup>(1)</sup> : show reply path.
<b>Alphabet management</b>	Enables the definition of SMS data coding for SMS sending.
<b>Memory status</b>	Memory used on the cellphone.
<b>Preferred storage</b>	Select default message storage, SIM or cellphone.
<b>Preferred bearer</b>	Bearer preference.

# 6 Email .....




Your cellphone has an email client with the settings predefined for a few popular email services like – GoogleMail, Yahoo, AOL, etc. Besides this, you can set up other POP3 or IMAP4 email accounts that you may be using.

## 6.1 Access

Touch  from tool bar to enter the main menu, select "Email".



## 6.2 Email account set-up

### Pre-defined email service

If you own an email account of predefined services, you can install it to your cellphone by selecting the service (GoogleMail, yahoo, etc.), entering the username, password and account name, and then confirming with by touching .

### New email service

To set up a new email account other than the predefined email services, touch  and then "Other Email accounts".

You are required to enter your email address, display name, password, account name, then confirm by touching  After you'll need to select protocol<sup>(1)</sup> (POP3 or IMAP4) and network, then enter your incoming server address and outgoing server address, select by touching .

## 6.3 Write email

Touch  to enter write email interface.

You can add recipient by entering Email address from enter bar, or selecting contact from Contacts.

## 6.4 Inbox

Folder of all received Emails.

## 6.5 Outbox

Folder of all unsent Emails.

## 6.6 Sent

Folder of all sent Emails.

## 6.7 Drafts

Folder of all draft Emails.

## 6.8 Available options

<b>Signature</b>	To attach your signature when sending emails.
<b>Check interval</b>	To check for new emails at a pre-set interval.
<b>Edit account</b>	To edit the detailed configuration information of the selected account.
<b>Delete account</b>	To delete the current selected account.
<b>Online/Offline</b> <sup>(1)</sup>	To connect or disconnect from your mail server.
<b>Sync with server</b> <sup>(1)</sup> <sup>(2)</sup>	To synchronize mail flags (Read, Replied, Deleted etc.) and other user defined tags (Work, Social etc.) with your mail sever.
<b>Refresh</b> <sup>(1)</sup>	To check the latest status of your mail server.

<sup>(1)</sup> For IMAP4 accounts only.

<sup>(2)</sup> Only available when **Offline** is selected.

## 7 Palringo <sup>(1)</sup>

Palringo Instant message (IM) allows you to chat with other people using Palringo account. You can also connect to other popular IM services through Palringo, like Yahoo, AIM, GG, ICQ, GTalk, iChat etc.

Please note that the services accessible to you will depend on your client version and dynamic Palringo server options.

### 7.1 Access

To access Palringo, touch  to enter the main menu, select .

### 7.2 Open a Palringo account online

Before activating this service, you are required to open a Palringo account online. There are two ways to do this:

- Select "**Create an Account**" tab to open an account via cellphone.
- You can also open account directly on website:

### 7.3 Sign in/Sign out

To connect to Palringo instant message server, please select "**Sign in**" tab. You are required to input your Palringo account information, like username (Email address), password, sign in status, etc.

To sign out, touch "**Menu**", then "**Sign out**".

## 7.4 Add service

Various services (Yahoo, GTalk, ICQ etc.) can be added by "**Menu\Add Service**".

## 7.5 Chat

To start a chat, select one online contact, then touch "**Private chat**".

During chat, you can also exchange voice or photo messages with your community.

## 7.6 Contacts

### Add a contact

To add a contact, click "**Menu**", then select "**Add contact**".

First, you need to specify which service, Yahoo for example, you want to add the new contact to. Then input the contact's email address or ID.



Your request will be sent to the contact for approval. Once accepted, the contact's name and status will appear on your contact list.

### Delete a contact

To delete a contact, select one contact, then touch "**Delete contact**".

The selected contact will be removed from your contact list.

## 7.7 Groups




With this menu, you can "**Join a group**" or "**Create a new group**". You can begin chatting with all members in the group simultaneously.

# 8 Contacts .....



## 8.1 Consulting your contacts

To access the Contacts, touch  from tool bar to enter the main menu, and select "**Contacts**".

The whole contact list is categorized by all contacts , phone contacts  and SIM contacts .

Your favorite contacts are at the top of the entire contact list.

For the first time consulting your contacts, you are required to import contact from SIM card to your cellphone.

### Searching for a contact

Touch  to search for a contact by inputting the initial of his/her name. Subsequent letters may be added to refine the search. Alternatively scroll up/down to find the contact you need after reaching the initial letter within the contact list (A-Z) section. Or you just type on the hardware keyboard and you input will instantly appear in the search box.

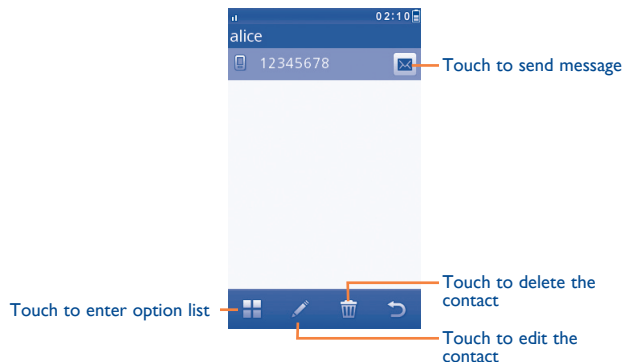

Select a name from your contacts to read the contact information.

## 8.2 Adding a contact

You can add a new contact by touching .

Following fields are accessible when you create a new contact in the Contacts by touching : **Name, Image, Save to phone/To SIM, Mobile, Work, Home, Email, Birthday, URL, Ringtone, Group** and **Address**. You can also add the contact to **My favorites** by tapping .

### Birthday reminder

You can set a birthday reminder when editing contact information. This will remind you 1 day in advance prior to the set date.


 If you use your cellphone abroad, store the numbers in your Contacts in international format "+" followed by the country code (see page 24).


## 8.3 Contacts importing, exporting and grouping

In **Contacts**, you can import/export selected contact from/to a SIM card and assign the selected contact to a group.

When viewing a phone contact's information, select "**Export to SIM card**" using .

When viewing a SIM contact, select "**Import to phone**" using .

To group contacts, you need to create a group first. Go to the All contacts or Phone contacts tab, tap  and select **Group**.

After you have created a group, go to the All contacts or Phone contacts tab, select a contact and enter its details screen, tap  and select **Assign to group**.

## 8.4 Available options




From the contact list, you can access the following options:

- Send message** Send an SMS/MMS to a contact you selected from the Contacts.
- Delete contact** Delete the selected contact.
- Copy to cellphone** Copy the contact you selected from SIM card to cellphone if there is sufficient memory.
- Copy to SIM card** Copy the contact you selected from cellphone to SIM card if there is sufficient memory.
- Group** You can view, send messages or e-mails to the group you select or you can create, delete groups as you want.
- Hide favorite contacts/Show favorite contacts** Hide or show your favorite contacts at the top of entire contact list in your phone contacts.
- My number** Type in, modify or send the user's own number by SMS/MMS/Email/Bluetooth.
- Preferred storage** Select the preferred storage location for messages.
- Memory status** View used and available space in SIM and Phone memory for contacts.
- Synchronization** Synchronize with the account you've set.

## 9 Call log.....

### 9.1 Access

You may access this function from the main menu "Call log".

-  Missed calls/Calls rejected by SMS
-  Outgoing calls (Redial)
-  Answered calls/Rejected calls

### 9.2 Available options

When you touch , you can have access to **Delete, Send message, Edit before call**, etc.

#### 9.2.1 My number

Type in or modify your cellphone number or the number to access your voicemail. Your cellphone number is usually written on your SIM card.

### 9.2.2 Billing <sup>(1)</sup>

You can access different items with this option:

**Last call cost/Total cost/Max cost/Reset cost/Price per unit** You can view the last call cost/total cost/max cost/reset cost/price per unit of charged calls, modify or reset them.

**Duration** You can view the total duration of all outgoing calls or reset it.

**GPRS counter** Management of data usage volume (in Byte).

**Beep duration** You can activate or cancel the beep emitted during a call with a specified frequency.

### 9.2.3 Call settings <sup>(1)</sup>

You can access a number of items with this option:

#### Call waiting

Activate/deactivate the notification of a second incoming call by a beep.

#### Call forwarding

You can activate, cancel or verify the status of the call forwarding to the voicemail or to a specified number.

#### Call barring

You can activate or deactivate the call barring for outgoing and incoming calls. The various options are:

##### Outgoing calls

The following configurations are possible:

- **All calls** All outgoing calls are barred.
- **All Calls Except SIM <sup>(1)</sup>** Outgoing calls to numbers other than those stored in your SIM card or cellphone are barred.
- **International calls** Outgoing international calls are barred.
- **International except home** Outgoing international calls except those to your country of subscription are barred.

##### Incoming calls

The following configurations are possible:

- **All calls** All incoming calls are barred.
- **All Calls Except SIM** Incoming calls from numbers other than those stored in your SIM card or cellphone are barred.
- **Roaming** Incoming calls are barred when you are abroad.

- Cancel all barring** Deactivate all call barring.
- Change barring password** Change the original Password for activating call barring.

### Caller ID

Activate/deactivate CLIR.

### Line switching <sup>(1)</sup>

Line switch between line 1 and line 2.

### Auto redial

You can activate or deactivate the automatic callback of your party for calls that do not get through the first time.

### Reject by SMS

Choose how you reject a call by an SMS, e.g., by selecting and sending an SMS template or by sending a preset SMS template directly. You can also view and edit SMS templates under this option.

## 10.1 Music player .....



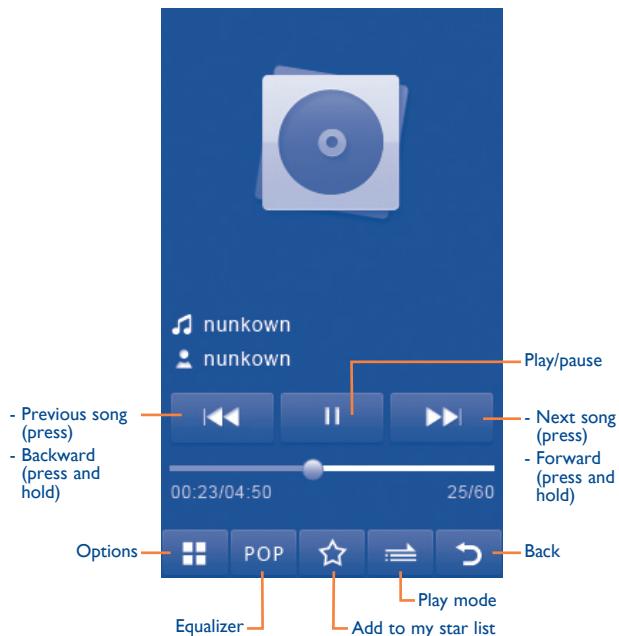
To access this function, touch  to enter the main menu and select .

You will have full flexibility of managing music both on your cellphone and SD card.

You can have access to your music files through one of the following:

- All songs** Contains all songs both on phone memory and SD card.
- My star list** You can simply add your favorite songs to "**My star list**" by touching  on the song playback screen (max 100).
- Folders** Category of songs in folder.
- Album/Artist/Genre** Music files are categorized by Album, Artist or Genre based on information stored in the tags. Those missing such information will be classified as "**Others**".
- Update songs** Update the information of songs saved in cellphone or SD card.

### 10.1.2 Settings

<b>Equalizer</b>	Different music styles preset in the cellphone for your selection. You may also customize it simply by touching  on the screen.
<b>Display</b>	Enable your player to display song information, lyric, etc.

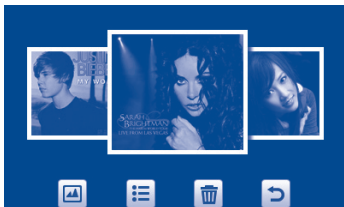

-  Back to previous menu.

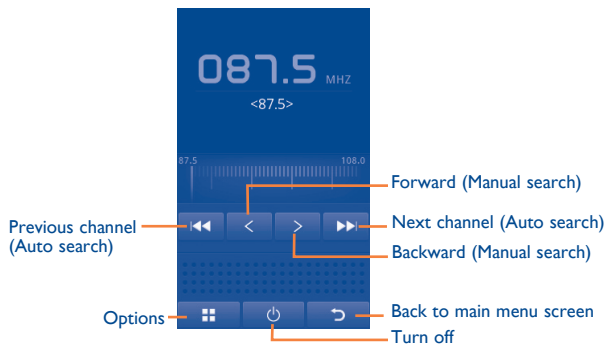
## 10.4 Radio .....



Your cellphone is equipped with a radio <sup>(1)</sup> with RDS <sup>(2)</sup> functionality. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with parallel visual information related to the radio program on the display if you tune to stations that offer Visual Radio service. You can listen to it while running other applications.



To use it, you must plug in your headset, which works as an antenna connected with your cellphone.



### Available options:

- Channel list** Open the list of saved stations.
- Auto search** Start auto search and stations will be automatically saved to "**Channel list**".
- Enter the frequency** Enter the frequency manually.
- Save channel** Save the current tuned station to the "**Channel list**".
- Record** Record the radio: files will be automatically saved to "**File Manager\My audios\Recorded**".
- Settings** Scroll up and down to manage settings.
- Activate loudspeaker/Play in headset** Listen to the radio using loudspeaker or headset.

Touch "**AccuWeather.com**" to access online website, which may charge extra fee.

## 11.6 Facebook

Facebook is a social utility that connects people with friends and others who work, study and live around them. # 13 Camera.....



Your cellphone is fitted with a camera for taking photos and shooting videos that you can use in different ways:



- store them in your "**File manager\My creations**".
- send them in a multimedia message (MMS) to a cellphone or an email address.
- send them directly by Email or Bluetooth.
- personalize your Home screen (see page 80).
- select them as incoming call image to a contact in your contacts.
- transfer them by data cable or microSD card to your computer.

## 13.1 Access


To access the function from the Home screen, touch  from tool bar to access the main menu and select the  icon.

## 13.2 Camera

### 13.2.1 Take a photo, save or delete

The screen acts as the viewfinder. Position the object or landscape in the viewfinder and touch  to take the image and the images will be automatically saved. If you don't want it, you may directly delete it by touching .

### 13.2.2 Settings in framing mode

Before taking the photo, you can adjust a number of settings by touching .



Touch  to access **My creations** to view the photos you have taken.

Touch  or  to switch between camera mode and video mode.


### 13.2.3 Options available after taking the photo

Once you have taken a photo, a number of icons appear on the photo so you can choose to set it as contact image, set as wallpaper, view it in **My creations**, or send by MMS, Bluetooth or Email and more.

## 13.3 Video

You can record a video clip of unlimited length, as long as the battery sustains and there is sufficient memory.



### 13.3.1 Framing mode

When you enter the "**Video**" function, you are in framing mode. Use the cellphone screen as a viewfinder and touch  for the **EV**, **Capture mode**, **Night mode**, **Quality**, **Record audio**, **Color mode**, and **Storage** settings.

Touch  to access **My Videos** to view the videos you have taken.

Touch  or  to switch between camera mode and video mode.

### 13.3.2 Recording mode

## 14.2 Meeting

When this is selected the cellphone will not ring or beep unless an alarm has been set. A new event will cause it to vibrate.

## 14.3 Outdoor

It is a profile designed for outdoor users who require louder ringtones.

## 14.4 Indoor

Ringtone/beep volume will be slightly lower than General mode volume.

## 14.5 Silence

This profile will turn off all ringtones, including notification sounds.

## 14.6 Flight mode

Voice calls, Bluetooth and Messages functions are barred. It can be used to increase standby duration.

# 15 File manager .....



You will have access to all audio and visual files stored in cellphone or SD card in File manager.

Two icons behind will indicate the saving locations of each file:

 Saved in cellphone

 Saved in SD card

## 15.1 My audios

Choose an audio file for an incoming call ringtone, a message alert beep, power on/off ringtone, incoming call ringtone, etc.

The "My audios" album contains the following folders <sup>(1)</sup>:

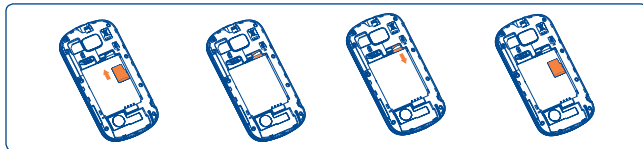

# 16 Bluetooth™ (1) .....

## Pair and register your Bluetooth device

Activate the Bluetooth feature by selecting the "Bluetooth\Activation\On" option. Then enter the "Device list\Search" menu to search for connectable Bluetooth devices. From the list, touch the device you want to pair directly or locate the device then touch  to connect. If the Bluetooth device has very limited I/O capabilities, such as a headset, you may need to enter a fixed PIN to register it with your cellphone, or you may simply get prompted to confirm the connection. If the device has a display and can accept a binary Yes/No input, such as a cellphone, you cellphone and the device will display a numeric code for comparison. Confirm the connection if the codes are identical and the devices will be connected. Or if the device has no display but has numeric keypad entry, such as a keyboard, your cellphone will display a numeric code. ## 23 Troubleshooting.....

It is strongly advised to fully backup the cellphone data and profile via PC suite before doing formatting and upgrading.

and carry out the following checks:

### My cellphone is frozen or cannot switch on

- Check the battery contacts, remove and reinstall your battery, then turn your cellphone on
- Check the battery power level, charge for at least 20 minutes
- If it still does not work, please use User Data Format to reset the cellphone

### My cellphone has not responded for several minutes

- Restart your cellphone by pressing and holding the  key
- Remove the battery and re-insert it, then restart the cellphone

### My cellphone turns off by itself

- Check whether your cellphone is locked when not in use, and make sure you don't accidentally turn off your cellphone when locking it by pressing the power key.

- Make sure you are in a place with network coverage
- Try connecting at a later time or another location


### **Invalid SIM card**

- Make sure the SIM card has been correctly inserted (see page 13)
- Make sure the chip on your SIM card is not damaged or scratched
- Make sure the service of your SIM card is available

### **Touch screen does not respond accurately**

- Make sure your cellphone is not locked
- Launch touch screen calibration by pressing and holding the volume up/down key, or alternatively, touch Settings\Touch settings\LCD touch calibration.

### **Unable to make outgoing calls**

- Make sure you have dialed a valid number and touch 
- For international calls, check the country and area codes
- Make sure your cellphone is connected to a network, and the network is not overloaded or unavailable
- Check your subscription status with your operator (credit, SIM card valid, etc.)

- Make sure you have not barred outgoing calls (see page 46)
- Make sure that your cellphone is not in flight mode

### **Unable to receive incoming calls**

- Make sure your cellphone is switched on and connected to a network (check for overloaded or unavailable network)
- Check your subscription status with your operator (credit, SIM card valid, etc.)
- Make sure you have not forwarded incoming calls (see page 46)
- Make sure that you have not barred certain calls
- Make sure that your cellphone is not in flight mode



### **The caller's name/number does not appear when a call is received**

- Check that you have subscribed to this service with your operator
- Your caller has concealed his/her name or number

### **I cannot find my contacts**

- Make sure your SIM card is not broken
- Make sure your SIM card is inserted properly
- Import all contacts stored in SIM card to cellphone

### **The sound quality of the calls is poor**

- You can adjust the volume during a call by pressing the  key
- Check the network strength 
- Make sure that the receiver, connector or speaker on your cellphone is clean

### **I am unable to use the features described in the manual**

- Check with your operator to make sure that your subscription includes this service
- Make sure this feature does not require an Alcatel accessory

### **When I select a number from my contacts, the number cannot be dialed**

- Make sure that you have correctly recorded the number in your file
- Make sure that you have selected the country prefix when calling a foreign country

### **I am unable to add a contact in my contacts**

- Make sure that your SIM card contacts are not full; delete some files or save the files in the phone contacts (i.e. your professional or personal directories)

### **My callers are unable to leave messages on my voicemail**

- Contact your network operator to check service availability

### **I cannot access my voicemail**

- Make sure your operator's voicemail number is correctly entered in "My numbers"
- Try later if the network is busy

### **I am unable to send and receive MMS**

- Check your phone memory availability as it might be full
- Contact your network operator to check service availability and check MMS parameters (see page 34)
- Verify the server center number or your MMS profile with your operator
- The server center may be swamped, try again later

### **The flickering icon is displayed on my standby screen**

- You have saved too many short messages on your SIM card; delete some of them or archive them in the phone memory

### **SIM card PIN locked**

- Contact your network operator to obtain the PUK code (Personal Unlocking Key)

### **I am unable to connect my cellphone to my computer**

- Install Alcatel's PC suite first of all
- Check that your computer meets the requirements for Alcatel's PC Suite installation
- Make sure that you're using the right cable from the box.

### **I am unable to download new files**

- Make sure there is sufficient phone memory for your download
- Select the Micro-SD card as the location to store downloaded files
- Check your subscription status with your operator

### **The cellphone cannot be detected by others via Bluetooth**

- Make sure that Bluetooth is turned on and your cellphone is visible to other users (see page 73)
- Make sure that the two cellphones are within Bluetooth's detection range

### **How to make your battery last longer**

- Make sure you follow the complete charge time (minimum 3 hours)
- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for at least 20 minutes after removing the charger to obtain an exact indication
- Switch on the backlight upon request.
- Extend the email auto-check interval for as long as possible.
- Update news and weather information on manual demand, or increase their auto-check interval.
- Exit background-running Java applications if they are not being used for a long time.
- Deactivate Bluetooth when not in use.
